Official Minutes of the Final Event/Conference of the Project "Youth Lead the Way from Zero to Hero: Sustainable Development for Climate Change"

Summary:

Objectives:

- to identify possible educational resources where youth people can find appropriate knowledge regarding the climate change.
- To increase awareness at youth about the importance of climate change education
- Promote the influence of the youth through peer to peer interaction
- Promote the education for sustainability and climate change

The inaugural event of the "Youth Lead the Way from Zero to Hero: Sustainable Development for Climate Change" project, WP1 - "Green Ambitions: A Youth-Led for Sustainable Development", conducted in Relleu from March 12th to 15th, 2024, marked a significant milestone in fostering collaborative efforts towards combating climate change and promoting sustainable development among youths across Europe.

Research Presentation (7 Oct, 10:15–11:00) – “From Participation to Leadership” —

Responsible: Lejla Imamovic. The session presented the project's research design done within the framework of the project, sample, and key findings on how youth move from basic participation to leadership in climate initiatives. It highlighted institutional enablers, peer-led models, and practical recommendations schools and youth centres can adopt. Outputs: slide deck, executive summary, recommendations sheet. Follow-up: integrate insights into the Final Guide and peer-to-peer club formats.

Stakeholder Discussion (7 Oct, 11:30–12:40) — Responsible: Ivan Ivanov. A moderated discussion with students, teachers, and professors explored how to embed climate topics in curricula and extracurriculars. Participants proposed creating sustainability clubs and launching local “green missions.” Outputs: discussion notes, ideas bank, shortlist of pilot schools. Follow-up: draft simple templates for clubs and mission briefs.

Final Guide Launch (7 Oct, 12:40–13:40) — Responsible: Andreu. The team unveiled the YouthZero2Hero Final Guide, walking through sections on resources, survey findings, visual evidence, and evaluation. Access, dissemination routes, and maintenance were clarified. Outputs: Final Guide v1.0, public link, dissemination plan. Follow-up: the feedback for the final design of the final guide.

Feedback, Q&A, and Tasking (7 Oct, 13:40–14:00) — Responsible: Viktor Bildirev. Participants provided final feedback and aligned on requirements for the Dissemination Event. A unified set of hashtags, content pillars, and a light reporting format was agreed. Outputs: confirmed dissemination format and responsibilities. Follow-up: populate the posting calendar and gather media assets from partners.

NSA & Sports Museum Tour (7 Oct, 15:30–17:30) — Responsible: Ivan Ivanov. A guided tour showcased the NSA facilities and the “sport & ecology” strand, linking active lifestyles with sustainable campus practices. Outputs: curated photo set and a short recap suitable for partner websites. Follow-up: publish a feature post connecting sport, health, and sustainability.

Task Preparation for T8.2 (7 Oct, 17:30–19:00) — Responsible: All partners. Partners co-created materials to fulfil Task T8.2: publicly sharing acquired knowledge in streets and on social media. Outputs included social templates, draft captions, target audiences, and agreed hashtags; channel owners were assigned. Follow-up: finalise and schedule posts during Day 2 practical sessions.

Practical / Non-Formal Sessions (8 Oct, 10:00–13:30) — Responsible: Viktor Bildirev. Hands-on work turned the templates into ready-to-publish posts per partner, with a shared posting calendar and a basic monitoring sheet. Outputs: finished copy + visuals, scheduled items, and a tracker. Follow-up: collect engagement analytics and refine messaging where needed.

Future Steps & Administration (8 Oct, 14:30–15:30) — Responsible: Andreu. The coordinator clarified the final assessment process, reporting templates, platform access, document requirements, reimbursements, and web dissemination. Outputs: confirmed deadlines, contact points per organisation, and an evidence checklist. Follow-up: partners submit complete admin packages by the agreed dates.

Meeting Evaluation & Final Discussion (8 Oct, 15:30–16:30) — Responsible: Ivan Ivanov. Participants completed evaluation forms and shared qualitative feedback on programme content, practicality, and logistics. Overall satisfaction was high, with suggestions to share materials

earlier and expand school-based examples. Outputs: collected forms and an evaluation summary. Follow-up: include insights in the closing report.

“Rising Heroes” – Local Initiatives Exchange (8 Oct, 16:30–18:30) — Responsible: Ivan Ivanov & all partners. Partners presented completed or planned local initiatives inspired by the project, exchanging contacts for replication and joint mini-campaigns. Outputs: short initiative fiches and a contact list. Follow-up: map replication opportunities and schedule cross-partner spotlight posts.
